Local Spotlight: Owen Cavanagh – Master of Sand and Surf Art

Meet Owen Cavanagh, a sunshine coast artist and creative powerhouse who brings inspiration to the community through his diverse artistic talents. Born in Nambour and raised on a strawberry farm in Tanawha, Owen's roots run deep in the region. Over the years, he has turned his passion for creativity into a thriving art career, leaving an indelible mark on the area with his unique sand art and dynamic Studio 53 Art & Surf Culture.



From Strawberries to Sand Art

Growing up on a farm instilled a love for the natural world, which fuels Owen's artistic expression today. His journey as an artist began in 1999 with the launch of Solearte Australia/Owen Surf Art, specializing in airbrushing and sculptures. However, it was a podcast interview with an American sand artist that inspired him to try something new: sand art.

"Sand art has been very spontaneous from the start," says Owen. "It's inspired by the things around me and symbols that empower me and others."

The Art of the Sand

Creating sand art involves much more than raking lines in the sand. Owen meticulously plans each piece, starting with the right tide times and often a central feature or symbol. "I began with a standard garden rake, but now I use different sizes and types," he explains. Locations like Coolum, Noosa, Mooloolaba, and Caloundra are carefully chosen for their visibility to the public—and lately, Owen has been using drones to capture his stunning creations from above.

Though his designs are often spontaneous, they always carry a positive message or encourage viewers to think outside the box.

One of his favourite pieces is a large smiling sun, created during only his second attempt at sand art. Another highlight was a collaborative project for a local band's music video, The Remains of Mr. Thompson – "Breathe", which can now be viewed on YouTube.

Building a Community Hub

Owen's creativity doesn't stop at sand. In addition to his sand art and sculptures, he realized a lifelong dream with the opening of Studio 53 Art & Surf Culture. The studio is a vibrant space showcasing incredible local artists, hosting workshops, and offering booths for rent. It's also a hub for community connection, with events and exhibitions that support local charities.

"I love collaborating with other artists and sharing my passion for creativity," says Owen.

Staying Inspired

Whether creating sand art on the beaches of the Sunshine Coast or curating exhibitions in his studio, Owen's work reflects his dedication to spreading positivity and encouraging artistic expression.

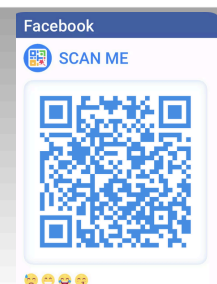
